35 HOTELS WITH FOOD WORTH STAYING IN FOR

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What looks like a hard-to-find taco stand in the hills of rural Baja California Sur is actually a Hilton Los Cabos feast at Tiki's Farm in Miraflores, featuring hand-pressed corn tortillas and freshly roasted vegetables ground into fragrant salsa molcajete. The farm experience isn't just for show; the chef sources much of the resort's produce from Tiki's. 95 percent of American travelers cite food experiences as a top travel priority, according to the World Food Travel Association's 2016 Food Travel Monitor.

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Expectations are and ought to be low for food at a resort, even one as swanky as the Grand Hyatt. Tidepools is one establishment that clears the bar. Its charming ambience beneath thatched-roof bungalows floating above a koi-filled lagoon is a welcome distraction between portions of braised pork belly, polenta crusted scallops and the soy-ginger glazed catch of the day.
